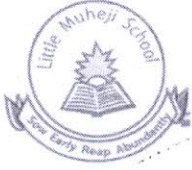

Dear Parent/Guardian,

END OF FIRST TERM 2022 CIRCULAR

In line with our 2022 theme of the Year "Rebuild, Restore and Renew Together", I have the honour to express, our appreciation for your continued support and for being an honest partner. By God's grace, we started and ended term one well. The Almighty continued to be merciful and blessed us with good health. It is my singular honour and duty to update you as we end first term.

Key updates

- a. **End of first term:** Tuesday 12th April, 2022 marks the end of first term. Continuous internal and external assessments were carried out throughout the term and this has been fully reflected on your child's report card, kindly study the report card and discuss with your child. Note that each child has been given a report card, marked assessment sheets and a holiday package.
- b. **Coping with post COVID effects:** To cope with and address the effects of a two-year lockdown among learners, a number of co-curricular, counseling and mentorship activities were enhanced during the term including athletics, sports, school band, debates, religious teachings, fellowships, praise and worship and field trips. By end of the term, we have noted great improvements in pupils behaviors, language being used, attitudes to studies and respect for elders and this has been manifested in the academic improvements among learners.
- c. **Medical enhancement:** Kindly note that the school has enhanced the medical section with a visiting doctor every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday supported by two full medical staff. The team continued to provide medical services to our learners and together with the spiritual nourishment from the Resident Reverend and Namirembe Diocese team. Our learners continued to have good life. I humbly request that children with unique health issues are requested to confide in School management so that we can devise means to help such pupils take their medicines in time and ensure adherence. Parents with children in boarding section are required to take them for general medical checkup and present a medical report signed by a doctor at the beginning of the term.
- d. **Transport:** School transport services remain optional, I encourage parents where possible to drop and pick up their children from school. With school transport, pupils are picked up and dropped at points of easy access but not homes. Pupils using school vans are required to clear transport dues to zero to avoid inconveniences. Transport is not included in the school fees structure. Transport fare depends on the distance. Please note that P.4, P.5, P.6 and P.7 day pupils are not in transport.

Note: There will be no school transport services during lunch time.

- e. **Key school events:** Confirmation for Anglicans and Blessing of candidates will be held on 23rd July 2022 presided over by Rt. Rev Wilberforce Kityo Luwalira, the Bishop of Namirembe Diocese.

g. **School requirements:**

- i. **School fees:** Functional fees remain unchanged; we request parents to plan and clear the fees before the start of the term to enable school enjoy the economies of scale amidst the escalating commodity prices. **Payment strictly School pay using individual's code.**

- ii. **One ream of Dolphin paper:** Each child from P1 to P7 is required to bring a ream of dolphin paper (**in 500 sheets**) every term, and nursery pupils one ream per year. This is to ease internal and external assessments.
